The AAAEA is a professional organization dedicated to helping its members succeed in their professions by networking among each other through seminars and social activities.

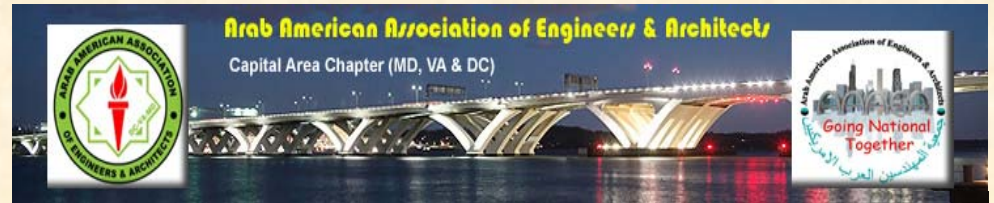

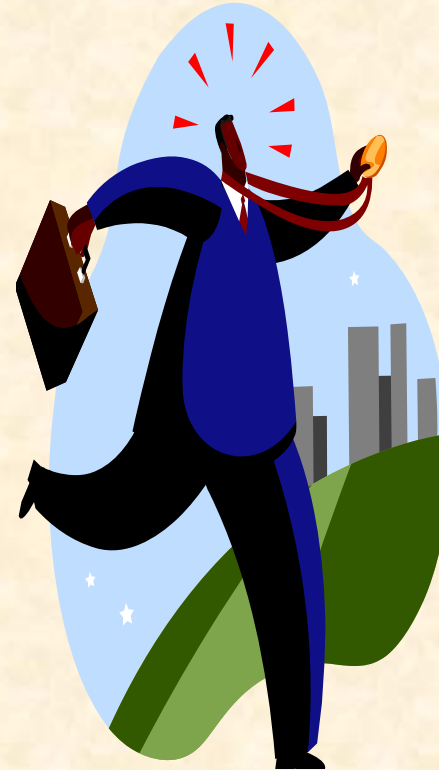
